After completing GER 202 or 205, students may select **ANY** of our 1000-level courses. No specific order required, and offerings vary. Majors & Certificates require 2-3 courses at the 1000-level. Courses include:

- GER 1004 German Business (Eco)System
- GER 1005 German Media
- GER 1010 Coffee and the News (1 cr.)

After completing ONE 1000-level course, students may continue to 1100-level courses. After completing ONE 1100-level, students may take a 1200-level course. Offerings vary. Some examples include:
