- Rapid social and political change characterizes the 19th Century in German-speaking countries. The rise of both socialism and nationalism, bourgeois demand for parliamentary politics, and increased industrialization transformed the political, social, and cultural landscape.
- This course will examine the correlation between socio-political transformations and cultural change. Students will analyze texts, music, philosophy, and art from *Vormärz*, *Junges Deutschland*, *Realism*, and *Naturalism*, and will focus on topics such as the role of women, the status of minorities, political revolution, class conformity, and industrialization and urbanization in Germany.
- All discussions and work will be in German.
